It has been an interesting first half of our stamp year. Two minor changes were made to the Constitution and we updated and added a few new By-Laws.

The major change was finding a new place to hold our stamp club meetings but we won't go into details that prompted our move. I believe most or all members know the reasons.

St. John's Anglican Church, our new meeting place on Spadina Crescent, is very co-operative in accommodating us with any requests we had. This new meeting place will no doubt be our new venue for many years.

We commenced earlier this year to put our meeting agenda on our internet site. This has been well received by our members, so this will be continued. Check our web page a day before meeting dates or during the day of the meeting. This will assist you in coming prepared for the meeting.

We also have had a few inquiries from people with collections to sell or donate. We have had four donations and one collection was sold with a commission fee.

Our filing cabinet has been "jam packed" for the past few years. Anyone that goes into it for items will agree. We approached the staff at St. John's and they gave us permission for a second filing cabinet - more co-operation. Within days we received word that our secretary's company AMEC has donated a filing cabinet to the club. Thank you Doug for having the arrangements made and having it delivered.

Before we know it our stamp show will be upon us. We require stamps off paper to pass out to the young children at the show. Bring in what you may have so we can make up ziploc bags of about 50 stamps per pack.

From the recent donations that members went through and bought stamps for 10 cents each, the remainder was made up into packages of 50. We made 31 bags. That's only a small start as we should have 200 to satisfy our needs for the stamp show and historic days at the museum. With the second filing cabinet we will have ample space to store the stamps.

We are constantly looking at ways to improve our information to club members. We have now included on the web site page under the "News Letter Link" the dates of our news letters and cut-off dates for submitting articles to our editor. Don't wait to the last minute but give our editor Martin ample notice.
